ORDER

The Hon'ble High Court of Judicature, Bombay in its order dated the May 5, 2014 directed (vide para 11) the Maharashtra Water Resources Regulatory Authority (MWRRA) in the matter of PIL No. 173 of 2013 filed by the Marathwada Janata Vikas Parishad & others seeking equitable distribution of water and also challenging certain provisions of the Maharashtra Water Resources Regulatory Authority Act (MWRA Act) and the Maharashtra Water Resources Regulatory Authority (Allocation and Monitoring of Entitlement, Disputes and Appeals and other matters) Rules 2013 (Rules-2013) as under:-

"In the meantime or thereafter, it will be open to the Regulatory Authority to give appropriate directions to the State Government and other authorities for releasing water from all concerned dams after two weeks from today in such quantity, for such period and in such manner as the Authority considers it appropriate. For such interim arrangement, if any of the parties wants to submit any representation to the Regulatory Authority, it shall be done within one week from today (such written requirement regarding interim arrangement of a party shall not exceed four pages in double spaces). It is further made clear that the Regulatory Authority is not required to give an opportunity of personal hearing to the parties to decide the interim arrangement unless it requires some clarifications / assistance".

- 2.0 Accordingly, the MWRRA issued notice to the Petitioner, Respondent, interveners, and the individuals / institutions who have submitted representations in pursuance to the direction of the Hon'ble High Court, Bombay to give an opportunity of personal hearing with a view to keep transparency in the proceedings of the matter, on May 23, 2014 at 16:00 hrs in the office of MWRRA at Mumbai to decide the issue of release of water from upstream reservoirs to Jayakwadi reservoir.
- 3.0 Proceedings of the said hearing in brief are recorded as under:
 - 3.1 The substance of representation of S/Shri Karbhari Maruti Agwan & Sachin Ramrao Rohmare is that the project planning of Jayakwadi Project does not envisage any provision for hot weather irrigation. The presently available storage in Jayakwadi reservoir is enough to cater for drinking and industrial requirements of water for one year. As such, they prayed that applications / representations in favour of releasing water from upstream reservoirs into the Jayakwadi reservoir in the Godavari river bed be rejected.



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- Ghumare, pleaded that water available in reservoirs upstream of Jayakwadi in Nashik district is reserved for drinking and allied purpose. If it is released from upstream reservoirs through river bed it will never reach Jayakwadi reservoir due to transmission loss. They further pleaded that their area is allotted water for perennial irrigation blocks since time of Britishers and these permission are still continuing. Large tracts of land of the applicants' families were taken away under the Maharashtra Agricultural Lands (Ceiling and Act Holdings) 1961 presuming that their holdings would continue to be irrigated. If their irrigation guarantee is now withdrawn, they will be put to a loss.
- 3.3 Abhijit Durgadasrao (Joshi) Dhanorkar submitted that during the year 2013, the Jayakwadi Project did not cater for a single rotation owing to the shortage of water. In spite of the Hon'ble Minister's declaration for 5 TMC of water to be released for Jayakwadi nothing could materialize. The life of farmers in Marathwada is dependent on Jayakwadi water. There is acute need of at least one rotation for hot weather before May 2014 end and the Authority may direct release of 3 TMC water for drinking and 5 TMC for hot weather irrigation.
- 3.4 On behalf of Padamashree Vikhe Patil Sahakari Sakhar Karkhana (Pravaranagar), it is argued that the Maharashtra Management of Irrigation Systems by Farmers Act, 2005 advocates the equitable distribution of water for the entire State. It is not understandable why its enforcement is restricted to the Godavari basin which is already water deficit. It was pointed out by the consultant of the Sugar Factory that the dead storage of Jayakwadi reservoir itself is larger than the combined live storages of all the upstream reservoirs of Jayakwadi. To fill in Jayakwadi from upstream storages is, therefore, not practicable.



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- 3.5 Shri Ravindra Parvat Dhawane put forth similar arguments as those of the Pravaranagar Sakhar Karkhana. He further pointed out that there is no basis to the provisions in the MWRRA Act regarding water scarcity, equitable distribution of water, guarantee of providing irrigation to atleast 1 acre of land for each land holder, etc. Also the condition of attaining 33% of live storage for a reservoir for getting excluded from the purview of scarcity is unjustifiable.
- 3.6 On behalf of the Petitioner, his advocate and he himself forcefully put forth their pleadings as follows:
- 1) The purpose of bringing out the Maharashtra State Water Policy & the Maharashtra Water Resources Regulatory Authority Act, 2005 is to enable the equitable distribution of the water in the State. However, Govt. has sanctioned in the meantime unauthorized demands in the State. Storages totaling about 50 TMC have been built upstream of Jayakwadi illegally depriving Jayakwadi of its rightful share of yield in Godavari basin.
- 2) The equitable distribution of water in Godavari basin every year is the responsibility of MWRRA.
- 3) The Marathwada region was denied justice on the pretext that in the absence of the rules, implementation of the Act was difficult. When the rules were subsequently framed, these were damaging to the interest of Marathwada. Due to the pressure, the rules were required to be withdrawn. Not having rules in place does not mean that the Act cannot be implemented.
- 4) Excessive Kharif utilization than is provided for in the project planning made in the upstream projects in Godavari basin has deprived beneficiaries of Jayakwadi reservoir their share of water.



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3.7 Shri Y.R. Jadhav representing the Marathwada Vikas Prathishthan (Aurangabad) as intervener pleaded that Govt. should take necessary steps in time to ensure the right of the deprived region to have equitable distribution of water. It is a statutory right provided under Sec. 12(6)(c) of MWRRA Act.

He further argued that the word "distress" in Sec. 12(6)(c) should be taken to mean the "deficit" of water. This is consistent with the meaning of पाण्याची तूट as is defined in the MMISF Act, 2005. Sec. 12(6)(c) is independent of conditions such as requirement of water for any particular use, or place, or delineation of area for irrigation etc. It simply implies equitable distribution of water amongst all reservoirs in a basin. In short this section is correctly based on the principles of State Water Policy and those of Godavari Water Dispute Tribunal.

3.8 Shri Rajendra Bawake on behalf of Godavari Kalwe Pani Bachav Sangharsh Samiti (Rahata), pleaded that the water for irrigation be distributed according to the planning which upholds the right of farmers who are sanctioned blocks in Kharif, Rabi & Hot Weather.

The horticultural crops, if deprived of water are most likely to be wiped out. Therefore, supplying water to horticultural crops without interruption is a practical need. Hence, right of horticulturists under the Godavari canals must be safeguarded.

3.9 Shri E.B. Jogdand, Chief Engineer & Chief Administrator (CAD)-Aurangabad, explained the storage and water requirement position of the Marathwada area, dependent on Jayakwadi water. The drinking water and industrial requirement till 31/7/2014 of this area can be met with the water available in Jayakwadi reservoir. In Jayakwadi command about 40,000 ha Rabi irrigation and 20,000 ha irrigation on backwater of Jayakwadi in Rabi has been realized by managing one rotation.

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
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Shri E.B. Jogdand also informed that the demand of *Godavari Kalwe Pani Bachav Sangharsh Samiti*, Rahata is being met from various storages in Daṛna – Gangapur Complex.

4.0 The Executive Director, Godavari Marathwada Irrigation Development Corporation, Aurangabad furnished the present (as on 23/5/2014) storage position of upper Godavari basin vis-a-vis the requirement on account of drinking, industry, irrigation (Hot Weather) including evaporation losses (copy enclosed).

5.0 MWRRA's Observations & Directions:

- 1. Looking to the information and analysis thereof it is clear that the entire committed drinking water and industrial requirement till 31/7/2014 for Jayakwadi can be met from the present storage available in Jayakwadi reservoir. Also it needs to be noted that there is no commitment on the part of the Govt. to give water for Hot Weather irrigation in the Jayakwadi command in this season of 2013-14. There are some reservoir groups upstream of Jayakwadi viz. Gangapur & Mula from which about 1.58 TMC (45 million cubic meter) of water is available for release for Jayakwadi. However, considering past experience, this quantum is so small that it may not reach Jayakwadi reservoir due to transit losses. Therefore, this Authority feels that against this background the release of water from dams upstream of Jayakwadi will not be of any use to the users downstream of Jayakwadi at present.
- 2. The next hearing in this case will be held on 9/7/2014 at 12.00 noon in the office of MWRRA.





3. The main matter regarding equitable distribution of water in Godavari sub-basin upto Jayakwadi will be heard and finally decided by 31/8/2014.

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4. All parties are directed to copies of their say / further say to the MWRRA and also serve copies including rejoinders, if any, to all the parties by June 30, 2014.

With these findings and observations, the issue regarding the release of water from upstream reservoirs to the Jayakwadi reservoir for the year 2013-14 stands disposed of.
